



## Stonecap Cabernet Sauvignon 2007 Columbia Valley

The 2007 Stonecap Cabernet Sauvignon is rich and robust with aromas of red cherry and bright berry. Hints of tobacco blend with hints of white pepper and toasty oak. Soft tannins create a smooth and approachable wine. Pair with grilled skirt steak and herb-roasted rack of lamb.

Stonecap wines are made entirely from estate grown grapes from the renowned Goose Ridge Vineyard in Washington State's Columbia Valley. This expansive (1300 acres) and highly regarded vineyard allows the Monson Family to produce stunning quality wines while remaining sensibly priced.

- Grapes harvested on October 13, 2007
- Crushed and spent 5 days on skins to allow maximum flavor profile before fermentation
- Pumped over twice a day
- pH at bottling: 3.86
- Total acidity at bottling: .50
- Alcohol: 13.6%
- Varietal: 100% Cabernet Sauvignon
- Cases produced: 3461

Washington State's famed Columbia Valley produces extraordinary grapes in large part due to the area's great soils, the result of massive flooding during the last Ice Age. Light and porous, these soils are frequently wind-blown and the windy tops of the many high hills and ridgelines of the region are typically devoid of soil, leaving a "Stonecap" of rocks behind.
